

#### Introduction

- It is our understanding of the final destination, that frames for us the significance of our journey
- False teachers had deluded their hearers into thinking that religion was about them and their experience, and not about their responsibility before their creator
- Peter makes a serious effort to bring the reality of his reader's situation back into view
- This world may seem like a luxury liner, but this world is coming to a climactic end, that is known scripturally as the "Day of the Lord"

#### K.N.O.W.L.E.D.G.E.

- K = Know to grow
- N = Necessary realities (Need to know)
- O = Object to False Teaching
- W = Ways of the False Teachers
- L = Learn and Lean into truth
- E = End Time Understanding

### 2 Peter 3:1-7

## **Believe what is Genuine**



- Peter makes his intent and purpose is two-fold:
  - 1. He wants to develop a genuine understanding
  - 2. He wants them to remember the message of the scripture
- What makes understanding genuine is that it is rooted or based on truth
- Bias toward what they wanted to believe, kept them from believing what was plainly true from scripture
- We don't believe God blindly; we have all the evidence from His word to make an educated decision
- "We need to see the world as the Word sees it; we need to refuse to see the Word as the world sees it"





- When Jesus' resurrection occurred in Jerusalem it led to an incredible anticipation among the believers
- Peter uses an interesting phrase, he says they "deliberately forget" that some things are true
- Many people today refuse to see that all of history is moving in the direction of a final conclusion
- The scoffers assertion is that "God is not going to break into history and interrupt the progress of time!"

# **Bank on What's Coming**

- Peter cites OT examples to prove that God does break into history
- The false teachers deliberately chose to ignore the fact that God had been involved in the world
- The world now "is stored with fire" and already prepared for judgment
- To Christians wondering about God's delayed return, Peter offers a three-part challenge:
  - 1. When has God ever failed to keep a promise?
  - 2. When has God ever fulfilled a promise in quite the exact way all of us smart people think he should?
  - 3. What could God possibly be waiting for?
