

Introduction

- Peter is writing at the end of his life to strengthen the 1st century Christians against the coming onslaught of false teachers who were wreaking havoc in the early church.
- Many people don't know what to believe nor what they stand for
- There are things that we "need to know" which are essential.
- Peter shows us 3 necessary realities that are a crucial part of our walk toward the truth and away from falsehoods

K.N.O.W.L.E.D.G.E.

K = Know to grow

N = Necessary realities (Need to know)

2 Peter 1:12-21

Remind and Recall



- It is imperative to make your calling and election sure as a guard against stumbling into error
- Outstanding coaches constantly review the with their teams, and athletes can execute the fundamentals consistently well
- Peter tells us how important he considers these things:
 - 1. They are so important that he is always going to preach and teach these things
 - 2. They are so important that he is going to stir believers to do them as long as he is alive
 - 3. They are so important that Peter is going to see that believers are stirred to do these things even after his death

Facts Not Fables

- In this passage we get a glimpse at the false teachings of Peter's day that he was combatting
- The Gnostic teachers were either fabricating stories with the intent to deceive or they were relating actually demonically inspired supernatural happenings they had experienced
- Modern false teachers also fit in the category of cleverly contrived myths
- Peter's testimony counters the heresy of the false teachers
- Our faith is based on eyewitness accounts and validated historical truths centered on the the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ





- Peter says scripture is not of any private interpretation
- 2 Peter 1:21 tells us atleast 2 things:
 - 1. Scripture did not come from the will of man
 - 2. Scripture was given by the Holy Spirit
- The Bible has one central theme: Jesus Christ. He is the key to understanding what God reveals
- Jesus Christ is the living Word of God and the Bible is the written Word of God
